Dr. Huang graduated from UCSF School of Medicine in 2008, during which he completed a Howard Hughes Fellowship at the National Institutes of Health studying skin inflammation and immunology. He subsequently completed a residency in dermatology at Washington University in St. Louis in 2012 as well as a postdoctoral fellowship studying skin resident T cells at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston. In 2014, he assumed the role of director of the Vitiligo Clinic at Brigham and Women's Hospital and has been involved with investigator-initiated trials and clinical and epidemiologic research focusing on vitiligo. He also completed a year-long mentorship program through the American Academy of Dermatology working with Dr. Amit Pandya in 2016.

In 2018, Dr. Huang established the Vitiligo Clinic at UC Davis Health in Sacramento where his research focuses on the clinical, epidemiologic, and translational understanding of vitiligo. He maintains a patient registry for patients with vitiligo and is engaged in clinical trials, and he directs the Phototherapy Unit at UC Davis Health. He has lectured nationally and internationally on the topic of vitiligo and maintains an interest in translating the increasingly robust understanding of vitiligo pathogenesis into meaningful patient care.
